"I <u>want</u> a holiday" (Present Simple)	She told me she <u>wanted</u> a holiday (Past Simple)
"Bob <u>is annoying</u> me" (Present Continuous)	Jane said Bob <u>was annoying</u> her (Past Continuous)
"I <u>have eaten</u> too much" (Present Perfect)	He said he <u>had eaten</u> too much (Past Perfect)
"The class <u>has been interesting</u> " (Present Perfect Continuous)	Anne said the class <u>had been interesting</u> (Past Perfect Continuous)
"I <u>saw</u> her arrive" (Past Simple)	He told me he <u>had seen</u> her arrive (Past Perfect)
"The team <u>were playing</u> well"  (Past Continuous)	John said the team <u>had been playing</u> well (Past Perfect Continuous)
"I <u>had arrived</u> before 9am" (Past Perfect)	She said she <u>had arrived</u> before 9am (NO CHANGE)
"We had already been dating for 3 years" (Past Perfect Continuous)	Mick told me they <u>had already been</u> <u>dating</u> for 3 years (NO CHANGE)
"I <u>will</u> take you out tonight" (will)	He said he <u>would</u> take me out tonight <i>(would)</i>
"I <u>can</u> easily pass the test" (can)	She said she <u>could</u> easily pass the test (could)
"You <u>must</u> leave immediately" (must)	He told me I <u>had to</u> leave immediately (had to)
"We <u>may</u> go out later" <i>(may)</i>	She said they <u>might</u> go out later <i>(might)</i>
"You <u>ought to</u> come at 7pm" (ought to)	He told me I <u>ought to</u> come at 7pm (NO CHANGE)
"I <u>should</u> have helped you"  (should)	He said he <u>should</u> have helped me (NO CHANGE)

She said she would walk the dog at night (would) (NO CHANGE)

"I would walk the dog at night"

"You couldn't do it" "He told me I couldn't do it"

(NO CHANGE) (could)

"I might arrive late" He said he might arrive late (NO CHANGE) (might)
