REGULAR HABITS or routines
Permanent situations
Scientific facts or general truths
Timetables
Stories, headlines, jokes
State Verbs (non-progressive verbs)

#### Time Expressions:

always, usually, often, sometimes, seldom, rarely, hardly ever, never, on Tuesdays, in the mornings, at night, on Saturday afternoon, in summer, at New Year's Eve; every... (day/Saturday/August/winter); once a... / twice a... / three times a... (day/month/year)

## Present Continuous

Actions HAPPENING NOW or around now Temporary situations
Actions in progress/changing
Arrangements for the future
Annoying habits or complaints (+ always)

#### Time Expressions:

at the moment, now, right now, at present, today, tonight, these days, this year, Currently, Listen!, Watch out!, Look!, Excuse me, tomorrow, next month, at 5 o'Clock, this afternoon, tomorrow morning

## Present Perfect Simple

Completed actions at an <u>unspecified</u> time in the past – we don't know WHEN (EXPERIENCE)

Actions that started in the past and Continue in the present or that have a Connection with the present.

Completed actions in the past with a RESULT in the present

#### Time Expressions:

already, yet, still, just, so far, lately, recently, for, since, never, ever, all my life How many times? once, twice, 3 times,...

## Present Perfect Continuous

Actions that started in the past and continue in the present – emphasis on DURATION Completed continuous courses of actions in the past with an undesirable RESULT in the present

#### Time Expressions:

How long? since / for, all (day, week, morning), the whole (day, week, night)
